To improve the treatment of mental illness in long-term care settings.

Sexually Inappropriate Behavior in LTC Facilities

Assessment of Geriatric Depression

5. Discuss conditions that can mimic depression.

1. Describe Mild Cognitive Impairment (MCI) and different stages of normal cognition.
2. Learn the science behind how to increase cognitive vitality.
3. Learn evidence based life style changes and cognitive vitality.

Why Does He Act This Way? Working with Older Adults with Cognitive Impairment

1. Develop a basic understanding of dementia behaviors, causes, and expressions.
2. State foundational skills to interacting with individuals with dementia.
3. Identify the value of providing a continuum of care during periods of transition for Veterans with challenging dementia-related behaviors.
